

## Doctrine—The Church—part 2 From sermon 1.5.20

## Read 1 Peter 2:5

Questions, Answers, and Review from Sunday's sermon: The Bible gives a couple word-pictures/illustrations of the Church: that of a body and that of house. In the house analogy, believes are a part of the house, not in the house. There are many vital parts to this living building—each important and required. Every believer should find membership in a local church (community, commitment, & accountability) and use his or her spiritual gift in ministry.

What were the four categories of house construction used on Sunday and what does each mean?

- 1. Foundation: Jesus Christ and the Word of God. See 1 Corinthians 3:11 & Ephesians 2:20
- 2. Frame(work): Biblical Church Leadership/Government. See *Ephesians 4:11-12*
- 3. Furnishings/facilities: Deacons & Member Ministers. See *Ephesians 2:19-22*
- 4. Façade: what the outside world sees, observes, and experiences in the Church.

Discussing the Frame (#2), someone read *Acts 20:17 & 28* printed here:

He [Paul] sent to Ephesus and called for the <u>elders</u> of the church...He said to them..., "Therefore take heed to yourselves and to all the flock, among which the Holy Spirit has made you <u>overseers</u>, to <u>shepherd</u> the church of God which He purchased with His own blood."

Besides obviously being the same persons/office, what other two truths about local church government was pointed out on Sunday? <u>Always a plurality (more than one) and male.</u>

God the Holy Spirit has Paul use three terms for Church leaders. State the title, review original the Greek word, identify the English use in church government, & cite an example where used.

<u>Leadership Title</u>	<u>Greek</u>	English Use	<u>Example</u>
Elder	presbyteros	Presbyterian	Presbyterian & Reformed Churches
Overseer	episkopos	Episcopal	Roman Catholic, Anglican, Episcopalian
Shepherd	poiman	Pastor	Baptist, various other denominations

[Note: some churches use congregational rule with a pastor/elder/teacher = Congregationalists. What are the problems with such a structure? Also discuss committees and sub-committees. <u>Great wisdom in taking input from the diversity of the Church, but democracy, voting, and majority rule are not in the Scriptures. The Church is to be led by a plurality of qualified male elders. Committees are helpful, but the final decision is to rest with the Elders (or delegated by the elders)</u>]

What is New Heights' leadership structure? Plurality of elders. No denominational oversight.

Why do you think the current trend is to avoid church membership? Various personal answers

How is a healthy church attractive to outsiders (some) and yet uncompromising in Truth? <u>People seek community and belonging.</u> The church must preach, teach, and live the Word of God. if that offends, so be it. But, in our conduct, attitude, and compassion, we must be gracious. See *Colossians 4:3-6*
