

## Why Are Things the Way they Are?—Part 2 From sermon 6.28.20

Read *John 16:33* 

Review from Sunday's sermon: <u>Pre-end-time events continue to unfold around us. The Bible made it clear these days were coming.</u> It also teaches why they come: the inevitable consequences of a world that has rejected God and His Holy Word. We know (from Genesis 3) that man is evil to his core. From Revelation, we know God has appointed a day to judge all evil and renew the world.

- 1. Left to his own sinful nature, mankind would devolve into a murderous chaos (Genesis 6). In His Grace, God has instituted four restraints of evil on earth. What are they?
  - Conscience
  - The Family
  - Human Government
  - The Church
- 2. We've already studied the dismissal and corruption of the first three restraints. What has happened in the Church—the final of the institutions? <u>Although it's had some revivals, victories, and reformations, it continues today to be influenced and silenced by the world.</u>
- 2a. What two main practices have led to the Church's insignificance in the culture?
  - The Abandoning of the Word of God—2 Timothy 4:3
  - The Tolerance and Celebration of Sin—1 Corinthians 5:1-2
- 3. Instead of preaching the Word and confronting sin, what are some of the common goals of the diminishing Church? Religious ritual = ceremony, repetitive memorized responses. Experience = prophecies, indwellings/tongues, healings, emotion. Practicality = feel good, positive, better worldly lives, overcoming, psychology, safe/anonymous
- 4. What have you struggled with most during these challenging days? <u>Various answers</u>
  - 4a. How have you handled your struggles (both positive/biblical ways and worldly/human ways)?
  - 4b. What changes could you make, this week, to be a better witness and light?
- 5. In the "Response" section of Sunday's sermon, what were some of our admonitions <u>in</u> the Church? Various Answers: <u>Demand Biblical Preaching, remember we are not home yet, get ready for more, have faith, exercise God-given wisdom, show an abundance of love and grace to others.</u> See *2 Corinthians 5:20 & 2 Timothy 4:2*
- 5a. What were some for <u>outside</u> the Church? <u>Stop trusting in man/human solutions</u>. <u>Practice civil obedience until the law/instructions violate the clear Word of God. Remember you're an ambassador representing Christ, keep things in perspective.</u>
