

Genesis 22 The Testing of Abraham From Sermon 1.24.21

Read Genesis 22:1-14

Review from Sunday's sermon: Abraham is one of the most important, significant people in Scripture. God has promised him that he'll be the Father of a great nation. It seems impossible, but Abraham is more than 100 years old, when he fathers a son. Then, God tests him by asking him to sacrifice Isaac—the child of promise. This section is packed full of meaning, symbolism, and lesson. God will test our faith.

- 1. What surely went through Abraham's heart and mind at this request? <u>Various personal answers. But, likely: question and confusion, fear, bargaining, grief, ...</u>
- 2. From our "Gift of Trials" series: What are four reasons we go through trials? How do you see each of these in this account of Abraham?

Two Different Events Pertaining to Two Different Aspects of Faith. Paul's Reference: Events Decades Earlier/Pertaining to the Promise of a Son from Sarah. James' Reference: This Event (Chapter 22) = A "Said" Faith vs. Genuine Working Faith
