Read Revelation 21:21-22:5

Questions, Answers, and Review from Sunday's sermon: The Holy Spirit now has John show us the internal character of the city and its privileged citizens. In incredible component of light in New <u>Jerusalem makes us consider the journey of God's light. There is no more curse on man/Creation,</u> and that means so very much in our blessed inheritance.

Scripture says there was/is a divine light from God—not our sun. It is reestablished in the New Heaven. Review the following journey of God's light.

Examples of God's Supernatural Light How Man Extinguished it • *Genesis 1:3-4:* a light used to be on Creation Adam and Eve chose sin • God's Spoken Word: Noah, Abraham, Jacob, Moses *Ignoring the Covenants/Promises • God's Written Word: the Law & the Prophets Discarding, altering, & Idolatry • Exodus 13:21: God's Guiding Light Lack of faith/Rebellion • Glory in the Temple Idolatry • *John 8:12*: Jesus Acts 3:15: Killed Jesus See also John 3:19-21 & 1 Thessalonians 5:5-8 How is the unsaved world still in darkness? See *Ephesians 4:17-19* The Scripture told us that there will be no temple in New Jerusalem (also no church). Why would there be no need for a house of worship? We are the church, we will be together, in the full, physical presence of God, and we will serve Him perfectly and be served by Him.
