

Thessalonians: Model Behavior—Part 4 God's Will for Your Life From Sermon 2.20.22

Read Ephesians 5:17-18 & 1 Thessalonians 4:3

Review from Sunday's sermon: We take another quick break from the verse-by-verse to examine the very practical subject of God's will for our lives. The Bible literally addresses a handful of scriptural directives on the topic. Then, leaves the believer to the discernment and wisdom of both the Word of God and the guidance of the Holy Spirit. 1 Thessalonians gave us one of those directives in chapter 4 and will reveal another in chapter 5.

- 1. What are some possible subjects over which a believer may genuinely want to know God's will? [As a faithful believer, hopefully, all subjects of life] <u>Various possible answers. Who I should or should not marry. What career path or job to take. Where to live and if I should move. How to deal with a relationship. Which way to go on a problem. Making a big purchase or investment.....</u>
- 1a. Which ones have you personally sought God's will over? Various personal answers.
- 2. What are the worst (or even forbidden) methods of determining God's will? <u>Anything the Scriptures clearly forbid = psychics, mediums, horoscopes. Just taking the easy or quick path. The sinful "I think God would want me to be happy". Ignoring godly counsel. Entertaining earthly/secular counsel. The "I know it may not be right. But, I'll fix it later." Randomly opening my Bible, putting finger on a passage, reading and copying whatever it says.</u>
- 3. What were the four clear "wills" of God taught on Sunday?
 - 2 Peter 3:9—Your Salvation: The indwelling of the Holy Spirit
 - 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18—An attitude of gratitude, joy in all circumstances, and a already devoted prayer life.
 - [Read earlier 1 Thessalonians 4:3]—<u>Sexual morality</u>
 - 1 Peter 2:13-15—Submission to God-Ordained Authority: The Word of God, parents (if still at home), church (elders), civic leaders and laws.
- 4. Read *Psalm 37:4, Proverbs 3:5-6, & Matthew 6:33* and discuss the precept that, once you've genuinely met the four clear "wills" of God, you can do whatever you want. <u>Various thoughts and insights</u>.
- 4a. What great fear forms in us from that truth? It's just so hard to believe. We've made so many poor choices, on our own, in the past. 2^{nd} reality = It is sometimes God's will that we fail occasionally. Makes us humble, sympathetic, learn, grow, and relate to others. We think God's will = easy, prosperous, worldly view of success, with no loss or trial.
- 5. What is harsh truth for the non-Christian concerning God's will? <u>God's not hearing their prayers. He's not going to reveal any more truth/plan until first condition is met = trusting in Jesus Christ, repentance, and surrendering to God's Lordship.</u> See also *Proverbs 15:29*
