

John: The Great "I AM" Gospel Pre-Series Study

Read Exodus 3:13-15 & John 8:54-59

Preview of the upcoming series: <u>Getting the identity of Christ correct is paramount</u>. <u>His deity is not proposed by myth, wishful-thinking disciples, future scholars, theologians, or historic agenda-driven church councils</u>. It is established by Jesus Himself and rooted in inerrant Scripture. From the doctrine of the person and nature of Christ flows correct doctrine on all other Christian subjects and disciplines: Scripture, salvation, church, end-times preparedness. This first study lesson is to get us thinking, studying, conversing, and exploring the Gospel of John.

- 1. We will learn much about John in next week's 1st message. But what do you know already? <u>Various answers</u>. God the Holy Spirit had him write one of the 4 Gospels. It contains many unique, memorable, and important passages. He was an Apostle, in the Inner circle. Sometimes a Momma's boy. His brother was <u>James</u>. He later writes Revelation. Lived the longest of all the Apostles.
- 2. Almost everyone knows John 3:16. Is this verse anyone's favorite? Can you recite it by heart? Often called "the summation scripture of the Bible". It's God's best "one liner". A Show stopper. The passage is, indeed, very good, but needs context and surrounding doctrine to avoid error. John 3:16 is a great example of the many powerful, theological themes and doctrines in this series. John focuses on what Jesus said vs. what Jesus did (= Matthew, Mark, & Luke)
- 3. John was an Apostle, a prophet, a teacher, & a pillar of *absolutes*. What are absolutes? How does our culture feel about them? Review these Western philosophical movements:
 - Modernism (reason, physical, science, deny all supernatural)
 - Post-modernism (relativism)
 - Post-post modernism (no truth exists anywhere. = Dark hopeless world. Create your own). See also *Judges 17:6* (Repeated in Judges 21:25) & *John 18:38*
- 4. How do each of these stand in stark contrast to God as revealed in Scripture? <u>God is a god of absolutes</u>. See 1 John 1:5 & James 1:17
- 5. John is the king of contrast. Read the following passages and note the contrasting absolutes.
 - *John 3:19*—Light and Darkness
 - John 5:24—Life and Death—Eternal Life and Judgment
 - John 8:44—Truth and Lies
 - John 15:9—Love and Hate
 - 1 John 4:3—Christ and Antichrist
 - Not from John, but from Jesus Himself in the Gospels, further revealing a God of absolutes. How about this hot button topic: *Mark 10:6*—<u>Male and Female</u>
