

John: The Great "I AM" Gospel John 1:6-13 From Sermon 1.22.23

Read John 1:6-13

Overview from Sunday's sermon: <u>As our mock courtroom reconvenes</u>, <u>John continues with his opening statement—the very claims that put Jesus on trial at the end of His earthly ministry & continue to demand a verdict today. More witnesses are called. As we have previously proclaimed, the biblical Jesus is the most polarizing person in history. His claim of deity also results in a universal indictment of all mankind for crimes against a holy God. He will either be their judge or their Savior</u>.

- 1. As our key text begins, something changed in history: The eternal Word [in the beginning, was with God, was God] graciously came to earth in the form of man. In church language, we call this the <u>Incarnation</u>. See also *Philippians 2:6-8*
- 2. The real Jesus—the Great "I AM" allows for only two Absolute Options: <u>Unbelief or Belief</u> = there is no hung jury, middle ground, fence riding, neutral stance, third eternity.
- 3. To sidestep the absolutes (in their captive souls), what have both the world and much of the modern church done with Jesus? Redefine Him. Fashion Him into a teacher, martyr, savior of their liking—not address sin. Remove His holiness to remove all of their guilt and shame.
- 4. Name the three sources/factors of Unbelief.
 - Satan/the enemy blinds them

[can we fully blame the devil, as some do? No. just one of three factors]

- They are spiritually <u>dead</u>
- They love their <u>sin</u> and do not want to be exposed. See *John 5:5-6*.

[Discuss: "Do you want to be well?" Many say no—not at the price Jesus requires. See Matthew 16:24]

- 5. What is the single source of belief? Who does all the work? <u>God.</u>
 The Churchie term is "monergistic". See also *Ephesians 2:8*
- 6. At the heart of Reformed Theology is the doctrine that Regeneration precedes Faith. John 6:44
- 7. When we buy into a doctrine of lost man possessing an unencumbered free will, inevitably what tactics will we employ to try to save them? <u>Various answers</u>. Emotion, fear, knowledge, sales tactics, promises...
- 7a. What is always the three exclusive and required components of salvation? <u>Election, the Spirit, & the Gospel.</u>

7b. In our evangelist efforts, what's the only one we play a part in? <u>Preaching and living the Gospel.</u> See *John 4:24 & Romans 1:16*
